

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP POST FIRST-YEAR ADMISSION A.Y. 2023/2024

In the evaluation phase of admission applications for the first year, the Master's program in International Business and Entrepreneurship may consider validating exams and granting admission to the second year for candidates holding additional university qualifications beyond the admission requirements.

Second year available slots

The number of available slots for subsequent years after the first is calculated annually based on the positions made available due to withdrawals, transfers, etc.

How to apply

- > Submit the application for admission to MIBE 2024/2025 as specified in the respective competition notice.
- In the online guided procedure, include, in addition to the course admission requirements, the exams for which recognition is sought.
- During the evaluation of the application for admission, the study program also assesses the declared exams, determining any recognitions and possible admission to the second year of the course.
- The offices will send the candidate the outcome of the evaluation.

Attention: In the case of exams already recognized from previous academic paths, it is necessary to indicate the exam from the original academic career (the first one in which the exam was taken).

In case of a number of applications exceeding the available slots

The allocation of seats for the second year of the course will occur in chronological order based on the applications submitted by eligible candidates. We remind candidates that, while assigned to the first year, it is still possible to apply for "exam validation" through the <u>Filodiretto</u> channel, only for the validation of exams obtained in previous academic paths.

Information notice pursuant to art. 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 on the protection of personal data Pursuant to Article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (hereinafter GDPR), the data provided by applicants will be processed by the University of Pavia, in its capacity as Data Controller, in order to pursue its institutional ends and carry out the University's public interest tasks, pursuant to art. 6 letter e) of the GDPR. In particular, the data will be processed to allow the provision of the specific services requested by users and relating to the completion of selection procedures for admission to study courses, as described in the competitive test notice, and the fulfilment of legal requirements. Data are collected in compliance with the principles of lawfulness, correctness, relevance, completeness and non-excess, in relation to the purposes for which they are processed. Data processing is based on respect for the general principles of lawfulness, correctness, transparency, adequacy, relevance, and necessity, using appropriate technical and organizational measures to protect the

privacy and the rights of data subjects. Processing is carried out, as a general rule, through the aid of computer-based and online tools to store and manage the collected data, in some phases paper-based media may be used, in all cases in such a way as to guarantee data security and protect the confidentiality of the data subject. Failure to consent to the provision of personal data will result in the applicant being excluded from the admission test/excluded from the selection procedure. Users' personal data may become known and processed, in compliance with current legislation on the subject, by personnel expressly in charge of data processing. The data provided by applicants will be kept by the University of Pavia only for the time strictly necessary to pursue the above ends and, in any case, in compliance with legislation on the conservation of administrative documentation. Applicants shall enjoy the rights set forth in articles 15-18 of the aforementioned Regulation, including: access to personal data, their rectification, updating, integration, deletion, etc. as well as objection to the use of data other than the institutional ends mentioned above. Complaints should be submitted to the Data Controller and/or Data Protection Officer (DPO).
