The project yearns to intensify internationalization between the two areas, through the joint planning and implementation of innovative academic programs.

The objectives are:

- creating an inclusive and diverse mobility scheme for students and academic staff between Italy and LATAM;
- designing and delivering innovative joint second and third cycle programs involving partner universities;
- implementing a comprehensive framework of joint Advanced Skills Courses (ASCs);
- creating two hubs in Latin America that will serve as focal points for the project activities, ensuring the sustainability of the cooperation beyond the duration of the project.

HerIT4Future is funded by the PNRR (National Recovery and Resilience Plan), through the NextGenerationEU Fund.

The project is part of the Mission 4 - Education and Research:

- Component 1 - Enhancement of the supply of education services: from kindergartens to universities
- Investment 3.4 - Education and advanced university skills
- Sub-measure T4 “Transnational education initiatives” (TNE)



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Presentation of TNE HerIT4Future Budget

Total budget: 1.988.761,28 €

Eligible costs:

- personnel fully dedicated to the project for coordination
- mobility for students and academic staff (professors and researchers)
- design of joint courses for students
- organization of advanced skill courses
- communication, dissemination and outreach activities
- meetings and conferences

The budget can be managed only by Italian Universities

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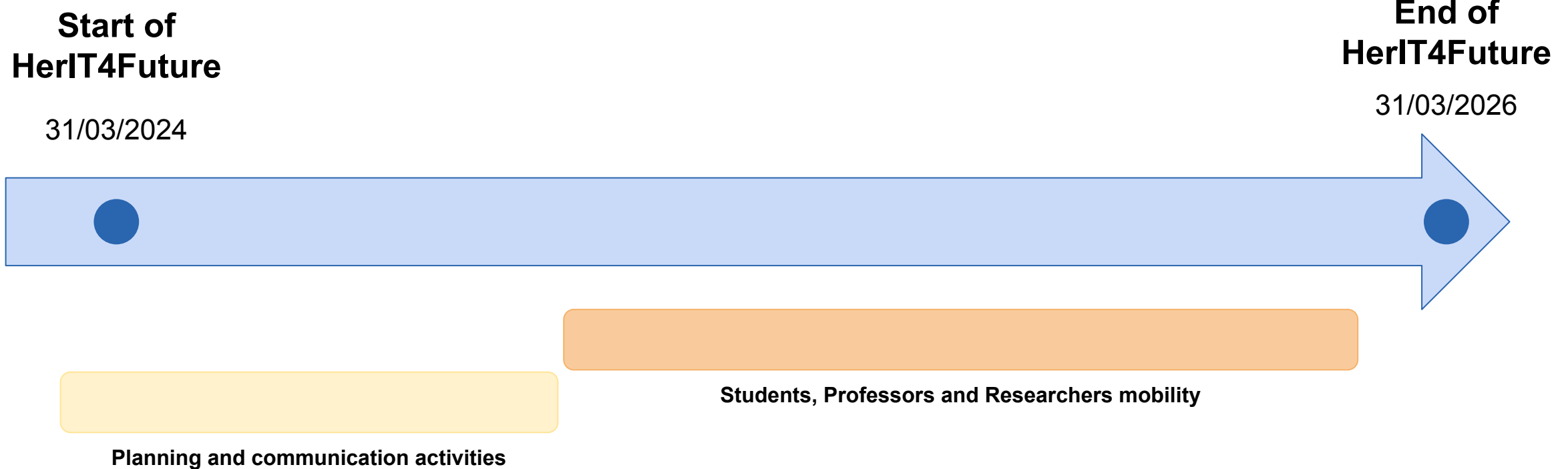

- ensuring the long-term sustainability of the joint Italian-LATAM collaborations deriving from this 2-year TNE project.

The protection and valorization of built and landscape heritage has a crucial impact in promoting socially and environmentally sustainable urban and rural development and in preserving local identities.

WP5 will organize 4 postgraduate ASC with academic staff from Italian and LATAM universities on “Built and Landscape Heritage”, establishing a new educational facility in Lima.

The topics of courses will be:

- sustainable urban planning
- structural and architectural design
- landscape protection and valorization

The WP7 aims to innovate the most relevant university courses in the aerospace sector, especially those on remote sensing data analysis and space systems, and to design and implement new ones.

Developing, via mutual learning actions, existing ties between Italy and Latin American institutions in aerospace training and knowledge transfer activities.

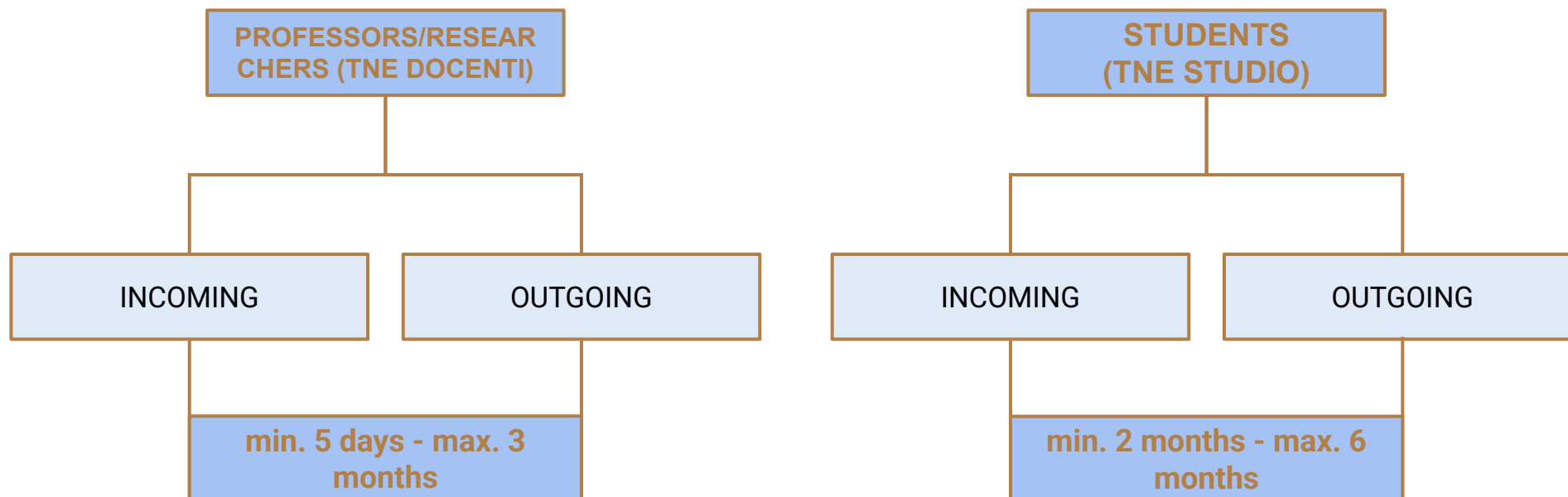
These goals will be reached through:

Steps for mobilities implementation

Guidelines for incoming students

1. Collection of partner Universities' International Mobility Office emails and first contact with their staff.
2. Partners Universities will run student selections, through a fair and open procedure.
3. UniPV will share with their partners the **TNE graphic; this must be used for all documents.**
4. UniPV will provide access to its Mobility Online platform for uploading student nominations.
5. UniPV Mobility Office will contact selected students for application guidance.



Steps for mobilities implementation

Guidelines for incoming professors

The partner University can select professors who will come to University of Pavia according to its internal procedure.

After the selection process, it's necessary **sending the nomination letter to:**

- the **UniPV** scientific coordinator of the project (Prof. Paolo Gamba, paolo.gamba@unipv.it)
- to **UniPV** Mobility Office (erasmus.staff.mobility@unipv.it).

UniPV will get in touch with the selected professors for clarifying the following steps.
